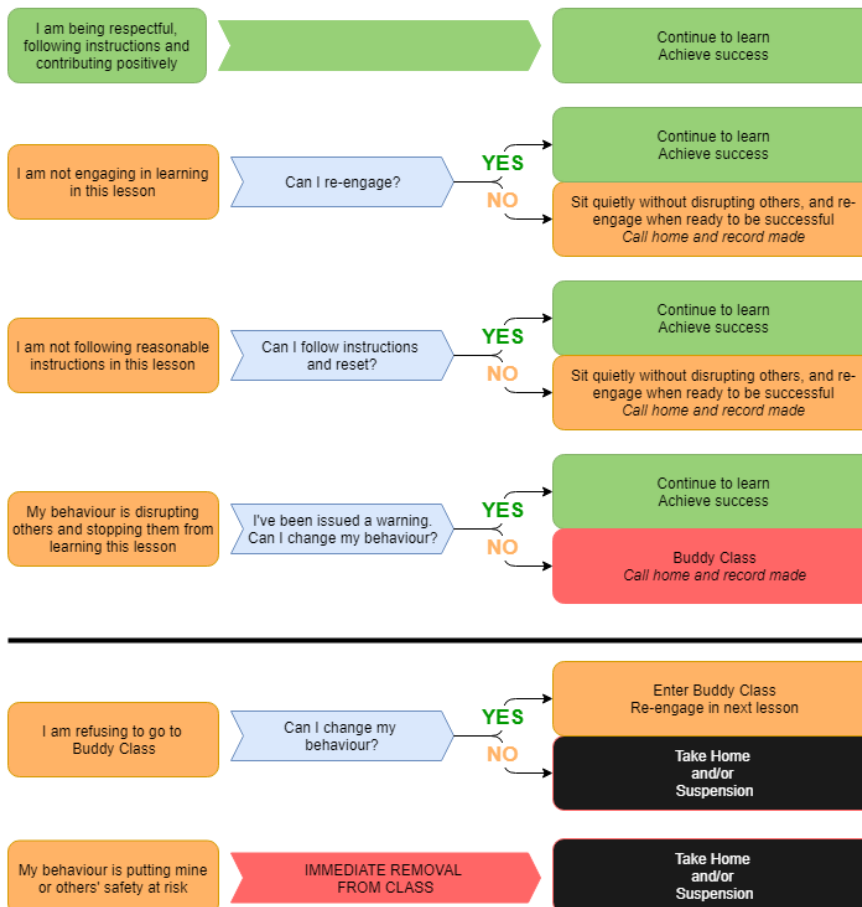


Are you making choices that positively contribute to our school community and culture?

Students are responsible for their own behaviour and the choices they make. Students who are able to make positive choices will be acknowledged by their teachers. For students that make a negative choice, teachers will support them so that they don't make the same mistake again and have Choices Conversations with students who struggle to uphold our school responsibilities. The table below describes what positive choices students can make to be a responsible community member and what choices they should avoid.

MY CHOICES DETERMINE MY SUCCESS



Students who are unable to make a positive choice will be sent to a Buddy Class.

If required the teacher may call the Rover for further support. Rover will attempt to resolve the concern and may issue buddy class/after school detention/take home.

Continuous failure to follow instructions will be followed up by the appropriate Student Pathways Leader.

Student Choices Conversation Steps - Teachers will address students who are not meeting the school responsibilities by having a Choices Conversation.

This involves:

- State the student responsibility they are not following
- Discuss why the school asks the student to meet school responsibilities
- Ask what concerns the student has with the responsibility
- Based on their concerns, provide them with a suitable option and ask the student to make a choice
- Students make an informed choice
- Teacher will communicate with home if required

The table below explains the choices students have when following the specific school rules outlined below.

Middle School	Senior School	Student Choices
School bags are to be kept in student's individual lockers which are to be locked. Students may choose to take bags out with them at break times if they wish.	School Bags can be taken to each class and kept near their desks in a neat and tidy fashion.	Students will return their bag to their locker. (MS) Students are required to bring a bag and required equipment to class. (SS)
Mobile Phones must be kept in their lockers during lesson time. Mobile Phones can be used for personal use during break times.	Mobile Phones must be kept in their bag during lesson time and are required to be turned off, or on silent.	Students will return their mobile phone to their locker (MS) or their bag in (SS)
There is to be NO eating or drinking in classrooms (except water).		Students stop eating and return food to their locker.
Students are required to be in MBHS uniform each day. Hoodies underneath polo tops/jackets etc are not accepted unless they are the Murray Bridge High School Hoodie.		Student corrects uniform concern. Attend SSO if in need of a loan uniform.
Students must use appropriate language both in the classroom and around the school.		Student stops using inappropriate language and apologises for being rude/disrespectful.
No balls or sporting equipment is to be played with/used inside any classroom or learning space.		Student returns the ball immediately without questioning.

Critical concerning behaviours listed below are not tolerated under any circumstance at Murray Bridge High School

- Threatening or perpetrating violence towards a student or staff member
- Vandalism of another person's property, or school property
- Physical or verbal threats or actions, or sexual assault of another student or staff member
- Consuming, selling, providing, possession of any illegal drug(s) at school

NOTE: Where illegal activity has occurred, SAPOL will be contacted immediately. Any social media concern will be reported to SAPOL. Students may be asked to pay for damages or stolen school property if behaviour is deemed not an accident.
